



Part Two: God Sent His Son Because of His Love for the World
John 3:16-17

Main Idea: God loves the world and sent His Son, Jesus, to redeem people.

- I. God loves His created world, even though it is broken by sin. (16)
 - A. God created the world.
 - 1. God owns the world.
 - 2. God can do whatever He wants with the world.
 - 3. God can choose to redeem or destroy the world justly.
 - B. Sin seeks to destroy the world.
 - 1. Sin entered into the world.
 - 2. Sin overtook the world.
 - 3. Sin causes all of the world to groan painfully.
 - C. God chooses to love the world.
 - 1. God loved the world. (Tense)
 - 2. God so loved the world. (Magnitude)
 - 3. God so loved the world. (Scope)
- II. God sent His Son, Jesus, into the broken world. (17)
 - A. God has always been a sending God.
 - 1. God sends in judgment.
 - 2. God sends in redemption.
 - B. God sent Jesus into the broken world to redeem and restore.
 - 1. God could have sent Jesus to condemn the world, but it was too late.
 - 2. God sent Jesus in order that the world might be saved through Him.
 - C. Jesus embraced His “sentness” for the glory to God.
 - 1. Jesus accepts the purpose for which He was sent.
 - 2. Jesus accomplishes the purpose for which He was sent.
